
students leave to take on new challenges and begin the next leg of their journey

DID YOU KNOW???

Every parent whose child attends Greystone Centennial Middle School is a member of the School Council, as well as the Friends of Greystone School Society, and we all have a voice in the decisions that are made at our school. Joining our volunteers at 6:30 pm, on the second Tuesday of each month, is also our Principal and/or Assistant Principal, and a School Board Trustee (if available). We may also have presentations by the different LCs, extracurricular groups and student groups within our school.

WHAT DO WE DO???

The School Council participates in discussions on school issues such as budgets, goal setting, curriculum and school board trustee issues that may arise. Our job is also to advise the Principal as to opinions and concerns of parents and students.

The Friends of Greystone School Society (FOGS) is our parent-run fundraising society supporting Greystone Centennial Middle School and is responsible for all fundraising activities which include the Welcome BBQ, casinos, Family Carnival, COBS, Value Village FUNdrive, Breakfast and Forgotten Lunch Programs, Hot Lunch and building our new playground, to name a few.

Participating in the School Council and FOGS is an excellent way to keep the doors of communication open between parents, teachers and administration.

WHY SHOULD YOU BE ACTIVE ON THE SCHOOL COUNCIL?

There are several great reasons:

- To be active in and knowledgeable of decisions that will affect your child;
- To be involved in the school;
- It is your right and responsibility, every parent in Greystone Centennial Middle School is a member;
- To get to know others in the school, from parents, to teachers, to trustees;

The following is a list and brief description of all the positions available for SCHOOL COUNCIL. A comprehensive list of duties for elected positions can be found in Council's Operating Procedures.

ELECTED POSITIONS

CHAIRPERSON - responsible for running the monthly meetings. They set the agenda, distribute correspondence, and work with the Principal and Assistant Principal to make sure school issues are covered at the meetings.

VICE-CHAIRPERSON - responsible for running the meetings if the Chairperson is unable to attend. The Vice-Chairperson is also responsible for creating the yearly report to the School Board.

SECRETARY – this job entails the taking and distribution of the minutes for all meetings, as well as filing any correspondence.

VOLUNTEER POSITIONS

BULLETIN BOARD - this volunteer would be responsible for maintaining the Council bulletin board; changing calendar removing old posters etc.

STREET SIGN - this volunteer will ensure the street sign is kept up to date with current events.

WHY SHOULD YOU BE ACTIVE ON THE FRIENDS OF GREYSTONE SCHOOL SOCIETY (FOGS)?

There are several great reasons:

- To be active in and knowledgeable of decisions that will benefit your child;
- To have an active role in deciding which fundraisers the school will participate in and where and how the fundraising dollars will be spent;
- It is your right and responsibility, every parent in Greystone Centennial Middle School is a member;
- To get to know others in the school, from parents, to teachers, to trustees;

The following is a list and brief description of all the positions available for FOGS.

ELECTED POSITIONS

PRESIDENT - responsible for running the monthly meetings. They set the agenda, distribute correspondence, and work with the Administration to make decisions about where the fundraising dollars will go.

VICE PRESIDENT – responsible to run the meetings if the President is unable to attend, work with and support the President in agenda prep.

SECRETARY - this position includes the taking and distribution of the minutes for all meetings, ensuring the minutes accurately reflect the directions agreed to at the meetings, as well as filing any correspondence.

TREASURER - responsible for maintaining the accounting for all of FOGS fundraising activities, writing cheques, presenting a financial statement at each meeting and preparing a yearly budget.

VOLUNTEER POSITIONS

FUNDRAISING COORDINATOR - the liaison between the Society and the School Council. They help to decide what fundraising activities will be held and assist the activity coordinators as needed

CASINO COORDINATOR - responsible for all things associated with a casino; filling out paperwork, filing paperwork, liaison with the casino, finding volunteers for the casino, etc.

GRANT COORDINATOR - responsible for forming a committee and applying for grants as needed.

HOT LUNCH COORDINATOR - responsible for setting hot lunch days in coordination with administration. Also decides on what is being served for hot lunch and ensures everything is at the school for the hot lunch day and coordinating a volunteer schedule.

BREAKFAST TO GO PROGRAM COORDINATOR - responsible for running the program, purchasing the groceries needed, and organizing set up and clean up on the days the program runs.

FORGOTTEN LUNCH PROGRAM COORDINATOR - responsible for purchasing the items needed for the program, making the sandwiches, and communicating with front-end staff when restocking is needed.
